

## DRILLING WORK ON RUE SAINT-JACQUES

As part of the Turcot construction project, the ministère des Transports has been carrying out drilling work over the last few months on rue Saint-Jacques between avenue Girouard and rue Addington.

As of August 3, the work will be carried out 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for a maximum period of 4 weeks.

This is necessary to divert the Haut Saint-Pierre collector sewer. Note that this component of the wastewater system of Ville de Montréal must be partially diverted to enable the reconstruction of the Saint-Jacques overpass.

### Mitigation measures during the work

To limit the inconvenience caused to residents living near the working site, acoustic protection will be installed around the machinery, in addition to the temporary sound wall that has already been erected on rue Saint-Jacques. The Ministère's environmental quality team will also make sure that noise levels remain within the authorized limits day and night.
